INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Pitt-Johnstown Information Technology is comprised of five specialty units providing unique services to the campus community: Information Systems, Printing Services, Technical Services, User Services, Mail Room.

OWEN LIBRARY

Owen Library is part of Pitt's University Library System and provides access to a vast array of databases. The library also contains individual and group study space and a computer lab.

PITT POLICE

Faculty, staff, and students can assist the Pitt-Johnstown Campus Police in making our campus community as safe as possible. Some services include: Preventing, detecting, and investigating of violations of University policy, Assisting vehicle lock-outs and battery jumps, Provide safety escort service, maintain lost and found and overall campus safety 24/7 365 days a year.

REGISTRAR'S OFFICE

The Registrar's Office is responsible for all academic records, registration, and enrollment services: FERPA Form Return, Transfer Credits, Veteran and Active Duty Services.

ROTC

The ROTC program has two phases: The Basic Course is usually taken during the freshman and sophomore years of college, with zero obligation of service incurred to the program or the Army. Eligible students can receive scholarships for full tuition and fees, in addition to a book allowance and a monthly stipend; alternatively, students can receive a scholarship covering room & board.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES & ENGAGEMENT

The Office of Campus Activities and Engagement provides a variety of out-of-the-classroom opportunities and experiences for students to become actively engaged in their campus, local, national, and global communities.
