Dear Pitt-Johnstown Student,

If you are not fully vaccinated, you are required to participate in mandatory weekly COVID-19 testing. Failure to comply has serious consequences including:

- **Revocation of access to University buildings, including classrooms.**
- **Removal from University-owned housing.**

Failure to adhere to these building restrictions will result in a referral to the Office of Student Conduct. Here is information on how to comply with the mandatory weekly testing.

- Set up a Quest account through [this link](#) and **order a Quest test kit TODAY.**
- Follow the instructions to order a test to your current address. If you live in University-housing or a residence hall, enter your on-campus mailing address.
- As soon as you receive the test, follow the instructions carefully on the testing kit to conduct an unobserved self-swab and mail it back **immediately** to Quest. You can drop off your test kit at the drop box outside of Health Services in the lower level of the Student Union. Or please find your nearest FedEx drop box (not the US Mail Service or UPS).
- If you have errors or need technical assistance, please call Quest at 855-324-7472 between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. ET Monday -Friday. After hours: 866-MYQUEST number 866-697-8378 and select "patient"
- **OR:** If you are vaccinated, [upload your vaccination card](#) to be removed from the mandatory testing list. Once you click Submit, a confirmation page will appear. Take a screen shot of your upload. Please note that email confirmation of your uploaded vaccination card will not be sent.

**Note:** If you miss class due to non-compliance with the University's mandatory testing, instructors will not be required to accommodate your absence. As previously announced by the University, all members of the University community who are unvaccinated or who have not disclosed their vaccination status are **required** to participate in regular testing.
