

GENERAL EDUCATION – Adopted Fall 2016

The University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown has adopted and implemented a new General Education program that begins during the Fall 2016 semester. Students admitted on or after that semester must complete the requirements of this General Education program.

A brief description of the requirements of the new program is as follows:

1. Students must complete ENGCMP 0005, ENGCMP 0006 and COMMRC 0052.
2. Students must complete one Quantitative Reasoning Course above the level of MATH 0001.
3. Students are required to take a total of 10 courses (30 credits) from the Worlds of Knowledge (WOK's) listed below. Students are required to take two courses (6 credits) within each World of Knowledge. The two courses taken in each WOK must be from different departments. Students will then take the final two courses (6 credits) from any of the four Worlds of Knowledge and from any department.
 - a. World of Aesthetic and Creative Expression
 - b. World of Global History and Culture
 - c. World of Societies and Civics
 - d. World of Science and Nature
4. Students cannot use a major required subject course in one of the worlds.
 - a. Example: A Biology major cannot use BIOL 0110 to fulfill a requirement in the World of Science and Nature.
5. Students cannot use a course to count both in the Quantitative Reasoning requirement and World of Knowledge.
6. Students can choose QR and Worlds of Knowledge courses from the published course lists below.
