





The chart below shows the number of degree-seeking students who applied, were admitted, and enrolled as first-time freshmen or transfer students.





Baccalaureate-Seeking First Time, Full-Time Students Stating Fall 2010*


There were 744 full-time, first-time students entered as freshmen in Fall Term 2010.

Retention of Fall 2015 First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen


First-time full-time freshmen in Fall 2015 that returned for their second year (in Fall 2016): 79%


Annual Need-Based Scholarships & Grants


61% of 2015-16 full time undergraduates received need-based grants or scholarships; the average award for the year was \$7,769.
